

How many pharmacists are there?





Non-communicable diseases (NCDs), also known as chronic diseases, tend to be of long duration and are the result of a combination of genetic, physiological, environmental and behavioural factors.



In 2020, NCDs will account for 80 % of the global burden of disease






Non-communicable diseases (NCDs): World view

As per the World Health Organization (WHO)¹:

 More than 36 million people die annually from non-communicable diseases (NCDs)



15 million of these deaths are before the age of 70 years

Prevention and control of NCDs require:

- Effective, cost-effective, affordable and feasible interventions
- National policies framed within these interventions and in line with NCD and risk factor indicators



- ✓ Improving equity in health care
- Targeting population for improved health outcomes


Pharmacists are an asset in the fight against NCDs

NCDs are an opportunity to strengthen pharmacists' commitment to patients and the community, towards sustainable and better use of health resources



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


Community pharmacy involvement in NCD screening/early detection




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Joint FIP-WSMI Statement on Responsible Self-Medication

WSMI

DEFINITION

Self-medication is the use of nonprescription medicines by people on their own initiative. Pharmacists have a key role to play in providing them with assistance, advice and information about medicines available for self-medication.

THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PHARMACIST

- 5. Pharmacists and the manufacturers of nonprescription medicines share the common goals of providing high quality service to the public and encouraging the responsible use of medicines. These are best achieved by adequate labelling and by ensuring that any necessary additional information or professional advice is given by a pharmacist or physician.
- 6. The companies represented by member associations of WSMI provide nonprescription medicines, the quality, safety and efficacy of which are guaranteed through the granting of marketing authorisations or other legally recognised procedures, operating through regulatory authorities in individual countries
- Advertising is helpful in informing people about medicines that are available without prescription. It should always be responsible and should not discourage the individual from seeking advice from a pharmacist or physician.

MEDICINES

 The manufacturer has a responsibility to provide medicines which are of a high standard of safety, quality and efficacy and meet all legal requirements for packaging and labelling and should work towards a world-wide standardised layout of information on labels.

- The person responsible for the medicine, who will normally be the manufacturer but may also be the primary distributor, has a responsibility to provide all the information needed by pharmacists to enable them to provide appropriate advice to members of the public.
- The manufacturer has a responsibility to ensure that claims made in advertising of a medicine can be substantiated scientifically, meet national regulations, industry guidelines and internal company controls and do not encourage inappropriate use.
- 4. The manufacturer has a responsibility to ensure that marketing methods encourage people to treat medicines with care and, to that end, not to take any action which could encourage people to buy excessive quantities of a medicine.
